Anytown Leadership Institute is a leadership training for incoming high school sophomores, juniors and seniors. Anytown takes place at OSU-Stillwater and delegates stay in campus dormitories during the program.

At Anytown, delegates build an inclusive community based on mutual respect and understanding. Delegates of diverse backgrounds have an opportunity to meet people whom they would not otherwise meet, and they often develop lifelong friendships and connections.

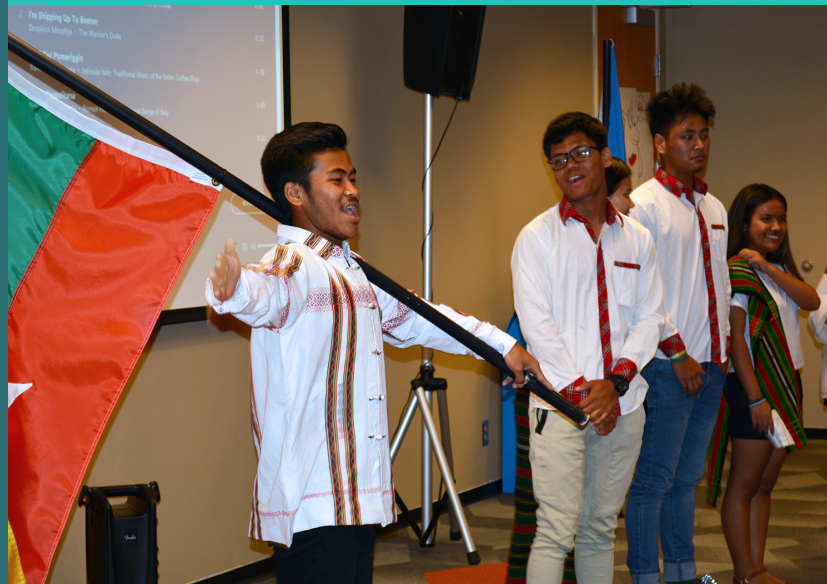
During the program, delegates participate in a variety of workshops and activities that develop their awareness and skills to lead in a diverse society. In a respectful environment and guided by experienced staff, delegates have the opportunity to discuss topics such as discrimination and stereotypes. Students also engage in action-planning for taking leadership on issues of inclusion and justice.

Over one thousand young leaders have graduated from Anytown Leadership Institute since 1994. Anytown graduates represent a wide array of careers, including the arts, business, education, journalism, law, medicine, military service, ministry, public service, scientific research, and social work.

How much does it cost to attend Anytown?

\$450. This includes round-trip bus transportation from either Tulsa or Oklahoma City to OSU-Stillwater, meals and housing, workshop materials, and an Anytown T-shirt. Insurance is provided for Anytown Leadership Institute.

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AFTER ANYTOWN: GWEN & STEVE MALCOLM INCLUSIVE LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

The Gwen and Steve Malcolm Inclusive Leadership Scholarship is a need-based scholarship available to graduating high school seniors and current college students who attended Anytown Leadership Institute.

Students are eligible if they have been actively engaged with the Oklahoma Center for Community and Justice or other community leadership and service groups. The \$1,500 scholarship will be presented to two students each year.
