ANYTOWN DELEGATES

Anytowners represent a wide variety of racial, religious, ethnic and economic backgrounds. The Anytown selection process begins with the submission of an application and a letter of nomination from an adult who is familiar with the applicant (someone other than a parent or close family member). All application materials must be received by May 1, 2011. Anytown 2011 can accept up to 70 students.

The cost of the week-long Anytown session, \$300, includes round-trip bus transportation from Tulsa to camp, meals and housing, an Anytown T-Shirt, and all workshop materials. Insurance is provided for the camp.

Scholarship assistance is available.

THE ANYTOWN STAFF

The Anytown staff is made up of a director experienced in conducting Anytown camps; adult advisors, all community leaders with human relations and communications skills; and college-age counselors, all Anytown alumni, who live with the delegates, provide guidance and facilitate the week's learning process.
